## About the Queer Arts Festival (QAF) queerartsfestival.com

The Queer Arts Festival is an annual artist-run, professional, transdisciplinary arts festival. Recognized in the top 2 festivals of its kind worldwide, QAF produces, presents and exhibits challenging, thought-provoking work that pushes boundaries and initiates dialogue. Each year, the festival theme ties together a curated visual art exhibition, performing art series, workshops, artist talks, panels, and media art screenings. QAF has garnered wide acclaim as "concise, brilliant and moving" (Georgia Straight), "easily one of the best exhibitions of the year in Vancouver" (Vancouver Sun), and "on the forefront of aesthetic and cultural dialogue today" (Xtra).

Led by founding Artistic and Executive Director SD Holman, Queer Arts Festival has incited dozens of artistic milestones, notably: Jonathan D. Katz's *Drama Queer* curated exhibition; the notorious Kiss & Tell collective's 25th-anniversary reunion exhibition *TRIGGER*, *Drawing the Line*; Jeremy Dutcher's first full-length Vancouver concert; the world's first entirely 2S-curated festival UnSettled, including Cris Derksen's monumental *Orchestral Powwow* and Adrian Stimson's visual art curation; the commissioning and world premiere of Canada's first lesbian opera, *When the Sun Comes Out* by Leslie Uyeda and Rachel Rose; coproducing the award-winning world premiere of Lesley Ewen's play *Camera Obscura (hungry ghosts)*, a fantastical reimagining of Paul Wong's early career; and the establishment of a year-round programming arm at SUM gallery, Canada's only queermandated exhibition space. QAF has recently inaugurated a publications arm, with four art books released and two more in the wings, navigating the coronavirus pandemic with unbroken commitments to every artist and staff member.

SD Holman was born in Hollywood, California and graduated ECUAD in 1990. They are an award- winning artist and curator whose work has toured internationally. A laureate of the prestigious YWCA Women of Distinction Award 2014, Holman is known for engagement with themes of sex, death, and identity. Holman's work has exhibited widely, including at Wellesley College, the Advocate Gallery (Los Angeles), the Soady-Campbell Gallery (New York), the San Francisco Public Library, On Main Gallery, The Helen Pitt International Gallery, Charles H. Scott, Exposure, Gallery Gachet, the Roundhouse, Vancouver East Cultural Centre, Artropolis and Fotobase Galleries.
